The next Escasoni Worship Service will take place at 2pm on Tuesday, February 10. The guitar group from St. James will be joining us for worship this month. Due to the physical size of the new Long Term Care Facility, it is taking much longer to transport patients from their rooms to the worship space/chapel. As a result, volunteers are asked to be at the facility by 1.15pm, ready to transport residents in order for worship to begin at 2 pm.

Escasoni Ministry-Volunteers Needed: The ministry at Escasoni is a long established part of the outreach ministry here at St. James. It is extremely important and greatly appreciated by the residents and pastoral care team at the Long Term Care Facility (old Escasoni Complex). While part of the ministry is conducting and leading worship each month, another huge part of the ministry includes pastoral care. How does Pastoral Care happen in this ministry? Residents get to know us, our faces and our names, and look forward to being greeted by the St. James volunteers each month. As residents are being transported to and from worship, many conversations happen in the elevators, as patients are being wheeled down the corridor to the chapel, or taken from their rooms on each particular floor. We create a bulletin for each worship. Residents often say they will take the bulletins and display them in their rooms."The pictures make me smile.....the pictures help me pray." are the comments heard from residents. Often St. James United volunteers are the only contact many residents have with those who do not work in the care facility. Some have no family or friends in the city to visit them. Often residents will say how worship warms their souls, or "puts Jesus in their hearts." Since moving to the new Long Term Care facility, worship numbers have increased and we are needing more volunteers to transport residents to and from worship, as well as providing a warm smile and a caring, listening ear to those we meet in our ministry. Worship is held every month on the second Tuesday. It is about a two

hour time commitment. Your ministry will touch someone's life in many ways beyond those few hours. If you have been thinking about being part of the ministry team at Escasoni, please contact Rev. Pamela for more information. Your help is urgently needed and very much appreciated.
