Minute for Mission: Our gifts to M&S support community ministries across Canada. Anticipation builds as the children and youth wait for the muffins they made to bake. Different ages and backgrounds, everyone joins together on a summer day at the London Community Chaplaincy. The chaplaincy provides advocacy and support for families who face the challenges of living in poverty in two housing complexes in London, Ontario. The summer programs are part of a year-round mix aimed at helping children learn while having fun. Drop in programs allow children to learn crafts and play cooperative games. Children are paired one-on-one to help improve reading skills so they are not left behind in school. M&S support for London Community Chaplaincy is key as it is one of their main funders for the year. Loving our neighbours is at the heart of our M&S.

United Community of Faith: The Downtown Churches Committee here in the city has been meeting for many years and has now expanded to include all of the United Churches in the city, under the new name of *United Community of Faith*. The main focus of the committee now is to take action on issues in which we have a common interest. A meeting of the expanded committee was held at Cowan Heights UC on October 4, 2017 with members of the original committee and Rev. Denine, Harry Rowe and Frank Fry in attendance. The expanded committee recently held an Asset Mapping Workshop at St. James with 52 individuals attending from all over the city. We are planning joint evening services. Gower will host the first service in May, and Cowan Heights will host the second service in October. We are considering Common Prayer for all churches. We are also considering a minimum fee for weddings for all churches. We have had discussions with Jerry Dick, Executive Director, Heritage Foundation NL, with regard to heritage related issues that may lie before us. We would like to hear from you, our congregation of St.
