Minute for Mission: Our gifts for M&S, together with emergency funds and Gifts with Vision, enabled us to build s church run high school in Haiti. The opening of a new secondary school in Duplan was the highlight point of the celebrations marking the 200th Anniversary of the Methodist Church in Haiti in February 2017. The United Church of Canada financed 80% of the cost of building the 7 room structure following the massive earthquake in 2010. The new school is bursting with 215 students and 19 staff. Already they are dreaming of adding computer and science labs as well as a playing field so students can safely play soccer. Education was the church's calling card to Haiti. In 1817, the first Protestant missionaries were authorized to come to the island nation on the understanding that their work would include providing schooling in the newly formed country. Today, the Methodist Church runs a system of 105 primary schools, 15 high schools, a teacher's college and 3 vocational schools. With children travelling up to 2 hours by foot to get to school, often without breakfast, the need for a major investment in education is clear. M&S makes these schools accessible to families with limited incomes, an important investment in the future of Haiti.
