Minute for Mission: United Church partner Affirm United offers a process, the Affirming Ministry Program, to help all ministries welcome people of all sexual orientation and gender identities. Our gifts to M&S support the Affirming process; our planning and conversations are made possible by your support. Any ministry in the United Church can become Affirming, but thus far there are no Affirming outdoor ministries or camps. Camping experiences can offer space filled with friendship, faith, community and a deep appreciation of God's diverse world; but differences can also create barriers. Unintentionally, campers with diverse ethnicities, economic status, sexual orientation and gender identities or expressions can be pushed aside.
