Prelude: Nocturne by C. Debussy

The nocturne, a piece inspired by nighttime, was a favourite genre among piano and orchestral composers alike. Debussy's Nocturne (1892) depicts a calm, peaceful evening. Its colourful harmonic language, typical of Debussy and his contemporaries, create gentle moments of surprise and enchantment.

Postlude: Menuet Francais by A. Tremblay

Menuet Francais is the second movement of Canadian composer Amedee Tremblay's organ work, Suite de quatre pieces.

The main theme, a lively dance in D minor, showcases the organ's incredible range of dynamics, changing swiftly between the softest stops and the full organ.

St. James Policy on masks in the building - August 19, 2021

Worship and other services:

Masking will continue to be required at worship services until you are seated; and required when singing and when moving around the building or exiting the building. This decision is made out of respect for our children, and others attending worship, who may not be either fully vaccinated or unable to be vaccinated.

We will continue to require pre-registration for our worship services and all other events taking place in the building until the need for physical distancing and contact tracing has passed, as defined by the Chief Medical Officer of Newfoundland. Our registration line is 700-6064, and Jennifer looks after registration for our worship services. She is available from 11am-4pm Monday - Friday and you can leave a message if she is unavailable. Please include your name, phone number, service you are attending, and how many guests are attending.

Office:

Visitors will be asked to wear a mask until given permission to remove their mask by the staff person they are visiting. Staff in the office will monitor themselves as is necessary. They will be free to remove their mask while working in the office provided they are comfortable to do so.

REMINDER: Any change in the mask restrictions does NOT change the need to sign in and out of the building, or to continue to practice physical distancing while in the building. In both the above policies we must recognize that should our (St. James) policy, or provincial policies change, we could revert back to stronger measures at any time.
