# All: It is right to give God thanks and praise.

It is right to give you thanks, Holy God, revealed in all you have made and present in the hearts of all your children. Today we give thanks with your sons and daughters of every age, who meeting you in faith have shared your grace in their lives. With them, we join the heavenly chorus to sing your praise.

All: O Holy, holy, holy, God,
O God of time and space.
All earth and sea and sky above bear witness to your grace.

We give you thanks, Saving God, for the witness of faith of those who went before us: for Abraham, Sarah and Hagar who ventured to a land promised but not seen; Moses, Miriam and Aaron who led your people into freedom; and your many sages and prophets who called them back into right relationship with you.

And we give thanks that in the fullness of time, Mary and Joseph rejoiced in the birth of your Child Jesus, the Promised One announced by John the Baptizer. We too rejoice in Jesus, in whom we have found faith and hope, your love revealed in all that he has said and done.

In a special way we recall the night before his death, when gathering with his disciples he took bread, and giving thanks, broke it, and gave it to them, saying: "Take and eat; this is my body, given for you."

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: "This cup is the new covenant in my blood.

Do this in remembrance of me."

We remember, Gracious God, and so we hold to Jesus' witness of love, proclaiming in our own lives the mystery of faith:

# All: Sing Christ has died and Christ is risen, Christ will come again! Sing Christ has died and Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

Like our ancestors in faith, we seek to live as Jesus lived,

our hands open in love to others, our hearts open to the saving gift of your Spirit. Send that same Spirit upon us and these gifts,

that all who share in this bread and cup may be the body of Christ,

joined as one with Peter, James and John, with Paul, Mary Magdalene, and all your saints both ancient and new, called together in service of his liberation, life, and love in your world.

Through Christ, with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory is yours, God most holy, now and forever.
