AFFIRMATION OF FAITH (The Apostles Creed, in unison)

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church*, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

HYMN: "We Gather Here" Voices United 469

- 1. We gather here in Jesus' name, his love is burning in our hearts like living flame; for through the loving son God fashions us as one: Come take the bread, come drink the wine, come, share the Lord.
- No one is a strangers here, everyone belongs; finding our forgiveness here, we in turn forgive all wrongs.
- 2. He joins us here, he breaks the bread, the One who pours the cup is risen from the dead; the One we love the most is now our gracious host: Come take the bread, come drink the wine, come, share the Lord.

INVITATION TO THE TABLE

One: Jesus' friends shared meals in his memory; though crucified, he was risen and present with them.

All: We share this meal together knowing he is with us still.

PRAYER OF GREAT THANKSGIVING

One: Christ is risen! All: Christ is risen, indeed! One: Open your hearts. All: We open them to God.

One: Let us give thanks. All: It is right to give thanks & praise.

One: Hallelujah! and praise to you, Ever-Living God, creator of heaven and earth. It is right that we give you thanks. You formed us in your image and breathed into us the breath of life. When your people turned away from you, you remained steadfast and constant. You saved them from the flood, putting a rainbow in the sky as a sign of your love. You delivered Israel from captivity, claiming them as your own and setting before them your way of life and blessing. Through them you have blessed all nations. Grateful for this constant love, we join your angels and saints in a song of praise:

All: O holy, holy God, O God of time and space. All earth and sea and sky above bear witness to your grace. Hosanna in the highest heav'n, creation sings your praise. And blessed is the One who comes and bears your name always! (More Voices 203)

One: Hallelujah! and praise to you, God of our salvation, for your Son, Jesus Christ. You affirmed him as your beloved and through the baptism of his suffering, death, and resurrection, gave birth to your Church, establishing a new covenant by water and the Spirit, your people born anew to a living hope. Called to embody his constant love in the world, we remember how on the night before he died, Jesus took bread and after giving thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: "Take, eat. This is my body, given for you." In the same way, he took the cup and gave it to his disciples, saying: "Take, drink. This is my blood poured out for you. Whenever you eat and drink, remember me." Hallelujah! and praise to you, Redeeming God. We do remember, grateful that on the day of his resurrection, Jesus was recognized by his disciples in the breaking of the bread, and that even today he comes to meet us as we share this meal. With joy we proclaim the mystery of our faith:

All: Sing Christ has died and Christ is risen, Christ will come again! (x2) (MV 204)

Open our eyes then O God, to the presence of your Holy Spirit, here with us and within these gifts of bread and wine, that they may be for us the body and blood of Christ, and by your Spirit we may be one with Christ and one another. Through Christ, with Christ, in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory is yours, God most Holy, now and forever.

All: Amen, amen, O Holy One! Hosanna and Amen! (MV 205)
