We give thanks for the land, for the Indigenous peoples who continue to steward it, and commit to be an inclusive community for all people.

WORDS TO CENTRE US: "I Am", John Clare (18th c. English poet) Each week we listen to a work of poetry/fiction followed by silent reflection.

CENTRING HYMN: "Come and Journey with a Saviour" *(seated)* **Come and journey with a Saviour who has called us from our birth, who has washed us in the waters, and who loved us on the earth.**

THE PRAYER OF JESUS (based on the spoken language of Jesus)

Name of names, our small identity unravels in you; you give it back as a lesson. Help us let go, clear the space inside, so your Name comes to live. Let your counsel rule our lives, clearing our intention for co-creation. Help us love beyond our ideals with acts of compassion for all. Give us the food we need to grow each day; untangle the knots within so we can mend our hearts' ties with others. Don't let surface things delude us, but free us from what holds us back. From you is born all will, from age to age renewed. Amen.

INVITATION TO THE TABLE

One: Jesus shared meals with saints and sinners, the faithful and doubting, revealing God's healing and reconciling love to all.

All: As we prepare to share in this meal together, may we know that God's love and new life surround and renew us.

THE GREAT PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

One: God be with you.All: And also with you.One: Open your hearts.All: We gladly open them to God.One: Let us give thanks.All: It is good to give God praise.

One: It is good to praise you, Holy God, as we gather around this and many tables seeking nourishment for the journey. You are a God of grace, bringing fresh insight in these days of renewal, helping us to discover anew your gift of relationship, a pledge of love given to our first parents and renewed again and again. No matter our failings, you consistently called us back, inviting us to repentance through your prophets and through Jesus offered a promise of forgiveness and new life. Grateful for your faithful love we join with all who have gone before us in their chorus of praise:

All: Holy, Holy, Holy, God of power and might. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is the One who comes in your name. Hosanna in the highest.

One: Even now, you renew your pledge, Gracious God, in this sacred meal where we gather in remembrance of Jesus and all he did for us. We recall especially how on the night before he died, he gathered with his friends. He took bread and after sharing the blessing, gave it to them saying, "This is my body, given for you." In the same way at the end of the meal he took the cup, and gave it to them saying, "This is the cup of the new covenant in my life's blood. Whenever you do this, remember me."

Recalling his death and resurrection, affirming his promise of abiding presence, we proclaim the mystery of your love:

All: Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again!

Enlivening God, as we continue to celebrate his memory, we honour your abiding presence with us. Open our hearts to your Spirit with us and in this meal. May all who share this living bread and saving cup be renewed in your covenant and affirmed in your love. Creator God, we praise you, through Your Word made flesh, in the power of your life-giving Spirit, now and forever. **All: Amen.**

SHARING IN COMMUNION

One: This is the bread of life, may it bring strength for the journey.

This the fruit of the vine, may it remind you of the journey's purpose

This is the banquet of blessing, Christ with us in our sharing, bringing joy in anticipation of our journey's end. **All: Thanks be to God.**

There is a main station for bread and side stations with juice in small glasses. Please consume the bread and juice before returning to your pew. If you are unable to come forward, someone will bring communion to you once everyone else who wishes to has already received.

PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION:

Spirit of grace and blessing, in our sharing of bread and wine,

you bring us nourishment for the journey. Strengthen us in these coming days and renew us in our dedication to you. Amen.


