A Penitential Beginning to Lent: A traditional way to begin Lent is to gather for prayer on Ash Wednesday, during which a cross in ash is traced on people's foreheads (or hand). This practice can be traced back to the biblical association between ashes and sorrow for sin. Ashes are also like soil and so invite us to consider how we come from the earth. While we associate this with more liturgical denominations, Ash Wednesday services are increasingly common in the United Church. You will have a chance to receive ashes at the end of the 11 am service on Sunday, February 26.

Reducing Paper Use for Lent: Traditionally during Lent people will give something up. Increasingly, people link this practice reducing their carbon footprint. At St. James, we plan to do the same collectively during Lent by getting back on our paper use, including for worship at 11:00 am on Sunday mornings. To accomplish this, we will be using the overhead slides more thoroughly with all prayers and hymn texts projected, and with better resolution. We won't be going 100% paperless because many people need to use a bulletin, including the choir, but we encourage couples to share. The bulletin is also posted on the website so we invite you to access it through your smartphone.

Reflective Wednesdays at Noon: Beginning on March 1, the Wednesday after the First Sunday in Lent, (Rev.) James will lead an informal communion service followed by a Bible study focused on the readings for the upcoming Sunday.
