INVITATION TO THE TABLE

Just as Jesus shared meals to show how everyone is loved by God, we gather now at table to celebrate God's all-embracing grace.

THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

God be with you.	And also with you.
Open your hearts.	We open them to God.
Let us give thanks.	It is good to give God thanks and
	praise.

It is good to praise you, God of the Covenant. In you we discover true meaning. The earth and all that dwell upon it find their source, all humanity made in your image is enlivened through your breath. **Creator, we give you thanks and praise.**

We praise you for your gift of freedom, for delivering your people from bondage, calling them at Sinai to holiness, and through your prophets renewing your invitation to justice and to love. **Spirit, we give you thanks and praise.**

And we praise you for the life of Jesus who healed the sick and comforted the sorrowful, challenged the powerful and uplifted the outcast, proclaiming your coming reign of peace and grace. **Christ, we give you thanks and praise.**

In faithfulness to your reign, he revealed your love until the end, proclaiming your forgiveness from the cross, and walking with us in the power of resurrection. In gratitude, we join the angels' praise:

All: Holy, holy, holy, God of power and might. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is the One who comes in your name. Hosana in the highest.

On the night before he died, Jesus sat at table with his friends. After taking bread and giving thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Take, eat. This is my body, given for you." In the same way, he took the cup, and gave it to them

saying, "Take, drink. This is the cup of the new covenant in my blood. Each time you do this, do so in memory of me." We do remember and praise your gift of love:

All: Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again!

Open our eyes then O God, to the presence of your Spirit here with us and within these gifts of bread and wine. May they be for us the sign of your covenant, that all who share this bread and cup may share his life, one with Christ and each other. Through Christ, with Christ, in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory is yours, God most Holy, now and forever. **All: Amen!**

THE PRAYER OF JESUS (Voices United p. 921)

SHARING IN COMMUNION (please respond to the bold text) The bread that we break, is our sharing in the life of Christ. The cup for which we give thanks, is our sharing in Christ's love.

Communion will be shared by intinction. Participants dip some pita bread or a rice cracker into non-alcoholic grape juice and consume before returning to their place. After this, communion can be brought to people needing to remain seated.

PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION (in unison):

We give you thanks, almighty God for this sacred meal. May the bread and wine we have shared, strengthen us to go forth to create in love, to work for justice, and to walk with hope for a world made new. Amen.
