INVITATION TO THE TABLE

Welcome to this table both here and across our community. Wherever you are, be assured that you are at Christ's table. A table where there are no divisions, where everyone belongs, where everyone is family in God's love.

THE GREAT PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

We gather in grace. In God who is around and within us.
And so we open our hearts. We open them to God's love.
Let us give thanks. It is good to give thanks and praise.

It is good to thank you, God of Unifying Love! We live in a world touched by your hand. Wherever we turn, we see diverse beauty oceans and forests, rivers and mountains, great trees and animals, all connected as one living community. We are grateful to be part of this interconnected whole, and more than that, to have been made self-reflective, able to ponder how we can contribute to this wider world. This capacity has given us power to shape the world around us, but sadly we have not thought enough of our impact,

not on the plants and animals and not on our fellow humans either. And yet you did not abandon us, but raised up prophets to remind us of your teaching, and sent Jesus to heal the divisions we had made. With thankful hearts, we join in creation's chorus of praise:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of pow'r and might.
Heaven and earth are full of your light. Glory to you our God.
Blessed is he, blessed are we, blessed are all who come.
Hosannas ring, archangels sing. Blessed are all who come.
Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of pow'r and might.
Heaven and earth are full of your light. Glory to you our God.

We sing to your glory, God of Liberating Grace, sing with thanks as a world community. We sing in commitment to share your love, a love that joins us as one family, a love that embraces all creation. This is the vision of Jesus who calls to us over the ages to resist our need to stand over others and instead to stand with them as we seek the unity and peace that you alone can give. Trusting that he is with us now, we remember how on the night before his death, he gathered with his disciples. While at table, he took bread, blessed and broke it. He gave it to them saying, "Take, eat, this is my body." In the same way he took the cup and gave it to them saying "Take, drink, this cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this when you come together in remembrance of me." In his memory we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died, Christ is ris'n, Christ will come again.

We praise you, God of Abiding Peace, grateful that Jesus stayed committed to your vision, even to death, and so through his risen presence enables us to live into the promise of your reign. We pray in that promise, praying that the same Spirit he breathed on his disciples be present with us and these gifts, transforming this meal that we share into a sign of our communion in him, one another and the world. May we live in union with him in service of your love. Through Christ, with Christ, in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honour are yours, now and forever.
