One: Jesus came to bring God's hope and peace to the world. All: In table fellowship may we know his joy and his love.

THE GREAT PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

God is here.	God is within and around us.
Open your hearts.	We gladly open them to God.
Let us give thanks.	It is good to give thanks and praise.

It is good to praise you, God of promise, as we gather on this Advent morning. We thank you for Jesus: born in Bethlehem, proclaimed by the Baptizer, bearer of good news for the world.

All: We give thanks too for the words of prophets, for the courage of Mary and Joseph, for the song of the angels.

With them we raise our own voices in praise:

O holy, holy, holy God, O God of time and space. All earth and sea and sky above bear witness to your grace. Hosanna in the highest

heav'n, creation sings your praise. And blessed is the One who comes and sings your name always!

God of hope we give thanks, for the child born to us did not stay in a manger but grew in wisdom and announced your reign. He grew up to heal the tormented, confront the powers, and make present your mercy. Arrested for his witness to your truth, he was put to death; in fulfillment of your promise, you raised him to life.

We give thanks for his birth long ago; for his life of hope and teachings of love, teachings lived out profoundly at table.

He embodied these teachings on the night before he died. Gathered with his friends, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them saying, "This is my body, given for you."

In the same way he took a cup at the end of the meal, and after blessing it, gave it to them saying, "This is a sign of the new covenant in my blood. Whenever you do this, remember me."

God of peace, we remember as we gather around this table, open to your presence as we proclaim the mystery of our faith:

Sing Christ has died & Christ is risen, Christ will come again! Sing Christ has died & Christ is risen, Christ will come again!

God of wisdom, open our hearts to the presence of your Spirit flowing within us and through these gifts. As you touched Mary and Jesus with Spirit's breath, so fill us with your power.

Renew us through this holy meal and send us pregnant with your grace to bear your love to the world.

Holy One we give you praise. Creator God, we praise you, through Your Word made flesh, in the power of your life-giving Spirit, now and forever.

Amen, amen, O Holy One! Hosanna and Amen! Amen, amen, O Holy One! Hosanna and Amen!

THE PRAYER OF JESUS (based on the original Aramaic):

Radiant One: your Name shines within us, outside us - even darkness shines in you. Create your reign now, that your one desire acts with ours. Grant what we need each day in bread and insight. Forgive our hidden past, our secret shames, as we forgive what others hide. Keep

us from forgetfulness, the temptation of false appearances and free us to walk your path with light and joy. For from you arises every vision; to you returns the birthing glory of the cosmos. Amen.

God of grace, we thank you for love revealed in Mary's child, experienced anew through bread and wine. Strengthen us as your Advent people, sharing the gift of your love. Amen.



Silent Vigils for Peace, December 11 from 5:30 to 6:30 pm: Beginning on December 11, St. James will be hosting a monthly silent vigil for peace. Given the many conflicts in our world, especially as we enter the second year of the war between Israel and Hamas, we all need a place to just sit together in prayer. This is to be a no-taking-sides event, and so we ask people not to bring signs, or wear clothes with slogans, or to engage in conversation about one issue or another. This is a place of silent solidarity with all the people who are suffering because of our addiction to aggression and violence, seen especially in the bloodshed and destruction in Gaza, in the ongoing captivity of hostages from Israel, in war and violence in other places in our world. Let's come together and prayerfully hold the world in love and a desire for peace.
