THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

God is here. God is within and all around us. Open your hearts. We gladly open them to God.

Let us give thanks. It is good to give thanks and praise.

It is good to give thanks Holy One. On this day our hearts are filled with joy. Your love is revealed in the birth of your Promised Child, a gift not only to his own people but to all the nations. Like the star that appeared to magi from the east, he revealed the light of your wisdom and love to a world in need of both. And so we now join the angels and echo their song of wonder and praise:

Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of hosts, all praise be given! All your glory fills the earth; all your power fills the heavens. Gloria, in excelsis Deo!
